






A DAY IN SEOUL

1. The Five Royal Palaces of Seoul



The five palaces of Seoul are royal palaces of the Joseon Dynasty and symbols of Korea's culture and history. Each palace has its unique charms: Gyeongbokgung Palace, the royal residence;



2. Dongdaemun Design Plaza (DDP)



This cultural space and design platform is a hub of exhibitions,

fashion shows, conferences, and events both domestic and international.

Its distinct curves and mega-sized roof are a triumph of 3D asymmetrical architecture.

This design, which symbolizes Dongdaemun area in the state of flux, was designed by the British Iraqi architect Zaha Hadid. The area includes Dongdaemun Market and other interesting sights.

4. Seoul Sky & Lotte World



Perched from the 117th to the 123rd floors of Lotte World Tower, the tallest building in Korea and the fifth tallest globally,

Seoul Sky offers a 360-degree panoramic view of Seoul from 500 meters above ground. The Sky Deck, a 478-meter-high observatory, is registered in the Guinness World Records as the world's highest glass-floored observatory. Lotte World is a cultural attraction consisting of Lotte World Adventure (indoor theme park), Magic Island (outdoor theme park), a shopping mall, and more.

5. N Seoul Tower



This broadcast and observation tower was opened to the public as Seoul Tower in 1980. Standing at 236.7 meters

upon the 243-meter-high Namsan Mountain makes this tower 479.7 meters above sea level in total. The observation deck at the top offers a 360-degree view of Seoul and dining services. Seoul Tower Plaza refers to B1 to P4, while N Seoul Tower refers to the observatory and transmission tower.

It was designated as a Seoul Future Heritage in 2018.

6. Ikseon-dong




This urban hanok village was created in 1920s and 1930s as a common people residential complex. Unlike the hanok villages of Bukchon or Seochon, the houses here tend to be smaller and humbler. Today's Ikseon-dong is a quirky collection of cafes, restaurants, and shops, mostly with retro aesthetics, and its popularity spread like a wildfire following the newtro revival among the youths.

A time to indulge in seoul!

K-FOOD STORY IN A HAPPY SEOUL

1. Grilled thin-sliced pork belly



This is frozen pork belly thinly sliced as if it was planed. Thanks to its thinness, it cooks quickly over heat. This dish has garnered many fans, as the unique smell of pork is lost while the savory flavor remains.

main ingredient : pork



2. Jumbo Galbi and Seaweed Soup




The star of this Seaweed Soup variant is the galbi. With boiled-down whole ribs to create this rich soup, this dish benefits from the seamless harmony between the chewy galbi meat and tender seaweed. Seaweed is low in calories and fat, making it ideal for weight loss, while its dietary fiber content makes it ideal for preventing constipation. Its rich calcium content helps to strengthen one's bones. What's more, this dish excels in the visuals as well, as the sight of a jumbo galbi swimming in the soup is both appetizing and satisfying.

main ingredient : Seaweed, beef galbi, green onions

3. Snow Crab Hot Stone Pot Bibimbap

Crabs are in season from winter to spring. If you visit Uljin at the beginning of the cold wind, don't miss the Snow Crab Hot Stone Pot Bibimbap. Along with Yeongdeok, Uljin is well-known as a snow crab collection area. Snow crabs that are rich in protein are considered healthy foods in the winter. Soft crab meat, sustainably harvested seasonal vegetables, and popping flying fish roe are served generously on the rice. It is a stone pot that does not cool down easily, so you can eat up to the last, warm spoon to melt even the cold of winter.

main ingredient: Snow crab, rice, flying fish roe, various vegetables, marinated crab



4. Seoul Sky & Lotte World



After applying soy sauce to the crispy fried chicken, it is fried again, much like sweet and spicy chicken. When you hear its name, you might think of a chicken with a strong, salty taste like soy sauce, but the savory flavor of fried chicken and sweet and salty soy sauce spreads in your mouth. Although it has now become a common type of chicken, Daegu chicken was the original in 1978. Back in 1991, in Gumi, an employee who worked there developed soy sauce seasoned fried chicken and spread it nationwide.

main ingredient: Chicken, fried powder, cooking oil, soy sauce, sugar

5. Stir-fried White Sundae

If you go to Sillim-dong, Seoul, there is Sundae Town, where sundae restaurants gathered. There are buildings where restaurants selling stir-fried blood sausage, which have long been loved as food for ordinary people since the 1970s, gather and operate. Here, Stir-fried White Sundae seasoned with salt and soy sauce is more popular than red Spicy Stir-fried Sundae stir-fried with red pepper powder seasoning.

main ingredient : Sundae, onions, cabbage, chewy noodles, sesame leaves





6. Hard Clam Soup (baekhaptang)



Hard clams, also called backhap in Korean, are known for their savory and sweet taste of the hard clam meat. The milky broth is quite refreshing. Only some peppers and crown daisy are added to the soup to highlight the natural flavor of the clams.


main ingredient: hard clams

7. Napa Wraps with Pork and Oysters

It is a food that is wrapped in cabbage wraps with spicy seasoned radish on fresh oysters and boiled pork slices. Oysters, which are nutritious enough to be called "milk from the sea," taste sweet with a chewy texture when eaten raw, and have a light savory taste when grilled or steamed. Put raw oysters, boiled pork slices, salted shrimp, radish, and kimchi on cabbage wraps and eat them all at once. Chewy meat, crispy radish, and spicy kimchi are harmonized and the taste was balanced well. It tastes good with Unrefined Rice Wine.

main ingredient: Oyster, pork, kimchi, radish, cabbage, salted shrimp
